

UPDATE So far 490 books have been read by students and 7 students have completed the challenge.


From the Art Room

Over the last 3 weeks, Prep students have been continuing to work on their collage skills by diving into some papier-mâché fun and creating some colourful jellyfish. Students started with a paper bowl as a template and used the papier-mâché technique to cover this in white paper. They then used square pieces of tissue paper (in colours of their choice) to collage over the top, and added long crepe paper strips for the tentacles. Prep students also worked on a nature collage where they collected items from nature and created their own cute or crazy creatures.

Grade 1/2 students also experienced the papier-mâché technique and created their own delectable, delicious, devine-looking (not tasting, unfortunately) DONUTS! Students worked so hard to get these completed within a tight time frame and did a tremendous job. Students began with rolling and twisting 2 sheets of newspaper into a donut size and shape. They then used masking tape for some reinforcement, and completed 2-3 papier-mâché layers. The following week, students painted these, carefully painting the dough part and then the icing. Lastly, students used REAL sprinkles for the final decoration. We have had to keep them away from some of the teachers as we feared many might encounter some real taste testings. Uh-oh!

Grade 3/4 students continued to work on their collage skills and created a collaborative Grade 3/4 project using paper construction techniques by cutting strips of coloured 'tabs'. This collage looks so effective and was fun to make. Students have also been working on agamograph self portraits. An agamograph is an art form that uses optical illusion to change the image seen in an artwork, depending on the vantage point of the viewer. Students used a photo of themselves and a sketched self-portrait to create this cool 3D illusion.

Grade 5/6 students have had 2 projects in the mix. They began with the mosaic collage technique where they chose a landscape (alpine regions, coastal and ocean settings, waterfalls, rivers, rainforests etc.), and used painted paper to construct their mosaics. We hope to have these finished next week. Students have also been working on a cardboard-constructed self-portrait, inspired by artist Kimmy Cantrell. While these may not resemble students exactly, they have been lots of fun to create and put together! Self-portrait constructions will be displayed in the main building corridor.

We are planning a very special last week at Community Osh to end our second full term .Please come join us for our very own Jurassic World week.





